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# What is the Federal Surplus Property Program?

- The Federal Property Assistance Program was created by Congress in 1949 with the enactment of Public Law 94-519. The law enables eligible organizations to obtain federal surplus property. As part of Public Law 94-519, state governments are delegated the responsibility to administer the federal property program through their individual state's "State Plan of Operations." The State of Alaska is pleased to be a part of this valuable service.

# Where does the federal surplus property come from?

- Available federal surplus property comes from various United States government installations worldwide. Most of the property that the Alaska Federal Surplus Property Program screens comes from military bases and government installations located in Alaska. The Property Management Office also has a federal property warehouse that eligible organizations can visit. The federal property warehouse is located at the following physical address:

# Eligible Organizations

- 8(a) Organizations
- State and Public Agencies
- Veteran Owned Small Businesses
- Certain non-profit organizations (health, educational, programs for the elderly, impoverished, and homeless)
- Native Villages/Corporations
- Certain educational activities of special interest to the armed services



# Examples of Property Available

- Heavy equipment
- Motorized vehicles
- Marine equipment and vessels
- Aviation equipment and aircraft
- Building materials
- Fire fighting equipment
- Hardware, tools, and equipment
- Musical instruments
- Gym equipment

# Completing and Submitting the Federal Application for Eligibility

- Pages 2–6 need to be completed by the prospective federal donee.
- The authorizing official who signs the application must be a director, chief, CEO, president, owner, or higher.
- The completed application will be submitted to the Federal Property Allocation Officer identified on the federal application for review.



# What can I expect when my organization is approved?

- Once your application is deemed eligible, you will receive an approved eligibility memorandum.
- Your organization can now receive federal surplus property.
- You will receive a link to our current inventory in Anchorage, AK.
- You will be given login credentials for GSAXcess to view available federal surplus property not only in Alaska but worldwide.





# GSAXcess

- GSAXcess is a website used by the federal government to list surplus federal property.
- Requests for federal property will be sent to the Federal Property Allocation Officer for screening.
- When submitting requests for federal property the item control number needs to be included in the request.
- Property can be screened worldwide.



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
